Notice is hereby given that **TRIO POWER Ltd**, ("the Company") with company registration number 15032495, having its registered office at **UK House**, **5**th **Floor**, **164-182 Oxford Street**, **London W1D 1NN** has applied to the Scottish Ministers for consent under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate **Cossans Solar and Battery Energy Storage System (BESS)**, and associated development, at land **1.6km west of Forfar**, **Angus Council** (Central point National Grid Reference: **40585 49648**). The export capacity of the proposed generating station would be over 50MW (in the region of **100 MW**), comprising 49.9 MW Solar (with installed capacity of 65 MWp) and 35 MW BESS. The proposed development is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment and an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Report has been produced.

Trio Power Ltd has also requested a direction under section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 that planning permission for the development be deemed to be granted.
